DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Information and Resources for Survivors and their Supporters

A survivor of domestic violence has critical needs that may include a safe place to be, safe people to be with and clear accurate information to help the survivor assess their situation and decide what to do about it.

The Human Response Network/Family Support Services (HRN/FSS) deals with the basic aspects of domestic violence and provides help to domestic violence survivors and their friends in understanding the nature, scope and direction of the violence. They will also provide strategies for gaining safety from further abuse.

The HRN/FSS Domestic Violence Program offers emergency safe shelter for women and their children and support services for all victims of domestic violence. Services are provided to survivors regardless of their race, gender, color, creed, religious beliefs, or personal lifestyle. Programs and services include:

- 24-Hour Crisis Intervention Hotline (530) 623-HELP (4357)
- Emergency shelter, food, clothing
- Typing assistance for Protective Orders (Victims Only)
- Court accompaniment services
- Advocacy for victims with other service agencies
- Peer counseling
- Group counseling

IF YOU ARE MAKING A REQUEST FOR A PROTECTIVE ORDER

You may be interested to know the following: If you are the victim of domestic violence and need assistance in completing the legal documents to obtain a protective order and cannot afford to hire an attorney, you may contact:

You should also be aware that despite the arrest of the person alleged to have committed Domestic Violence, that person may be released at any time.

If you call the Trinity County Jail, as the victim, you may ask to be informed when your alleged abuser is released from jail.

Once you have obtained a Court Order of Protection, be aware that the “terms and conditions of the Protection Order remain enforceable notwithstanding the acts of the parties, and may be changed only by Order of the Court.”

If you should decide that you do not need a protective order anymore, you must file a Request for Dismissal form with the Court to have your Protective Order nullified. You must also provide a copy of the stamped Dismissal Order to the Trinity County Sheriff’s Department to have your Protective Order taken out of their files.

As a victim of Domestic Violence, you can ask the District Attorney to file a criminal Complaint against the person who abused you.

You can also file a Civil lawsuit against the abuser for losses suffered as a result of the abuse, including medical expenses, loss of earnings, and other expenses for injuries sustained, damage to property and any other related expenses incurred by you, the victim, or any other agency that shelters you.
